Footsteps is designed for anyone who wants a deeper understanding of their faith and to develop skills useful for their particular ministry.

Footsteps 1, the one year course, has been running for several years.

It is now possible to continue with a 2nd one year course — **Footsteps 2**.

Who runs it?

Footsteps is a partnership between Regent's Park College, Oxford and the Central Baptist Association and the Southern Counties Baptist Association.

When does it happen?

Footsteps 1 [and 2] are held on 10 Saturdays, September to June, from 10 a.m. to 4.15 p.m. The dates for 2016-17 are:

10TH SEPTEMBER	4TH FEBRUARY
8TH OCTOBER	4TH MARCH
5TH NOVEMBER	1ST APRIL
3RD DECEMBER	6TH MAY
7TH JANUARY	10TH JUNE

Where does Footsteps meet in CBA?

Footsteps 1 [and 2] meet at the Church of Christ the King, Frithwood Crescent, Kents Hill, Buckinghamshire, MK7 6HG

What happens each Saturday?

There are five interactive sessions, opportunities for worship and prayer all together and in small groups, as well as informal times to chat over coffee breaks and lunch.

Are there any previous requirements?

Footsteps is open to everyone, whatever you have studied or not studied in the past. But we do ask that you have the support of your local church.

What does it cost?

For 2016-17 the cost is £330.

We encourage your church to pay two-thirds.

I really didn't know what to expect and the first day was a bit daunting. Since then I have learnt so much and it is all really interesting. The day flies by and it is quite interactive with lots of discussion, and actually I always find the sessions end too soon! I thought the history side could be a bit dry but actually it is fascinating. It is really nice to get to know other People from different churches in greater depth, who share something in common. What will we study in Footsteps 1?

There are 9 streams which run through the year:

- Understanding the Bible
- Understanding our Faith
- Deepening Spirituality
- Mission, Evangelism and Culture
- Baptist History and Principles
- Pastoral Care
- Leadership Skills
- Preaching Skills
- Leading Worship

While everyone studies 5 of the subjects together, there are also some option choices.

What can I expect?

- Interactive participation in sessions.
- A little preparation between Saturdays.
- The opportunity to keep a journal during the year.
- The **option** of writing some assignments.
- Challenge and inspiration from the sessions and from the prayerful support of leaders and fellow participants.

What will I receive?

A growing understanding of ministry and mission as you explore faith in the context of a supportive group. [There is also a final Reunion evening at which certificates are presented!]
