FINANCE: Giving to Home Mission: For funds to be included in the 2017 target it is important that if paying by cheque these are received by our Treasurer, Karen Hopkins by **Friday 15th December** in order to clear the account and be transferred to the Baptist Union by year end. All on line transfers should be done by **Thursday 21st December**.

Home mission giving by the Association churches to the end of September was £190,600, down from £222,313 in the 2016 equivalent period. Experience suggests that a significant part of the appeal arrives in the last quarter of the calendar year, and whilst we thank churches for these donations so far, we hope that it will be possible to get near to the 2016 final total of £329,478. Nationally the September total was £2,522.625 as against £2,509.913 in 2016.

FROM THE CHARITY COMMISSION: *Getting external scrutiny of charities right*
Charity trustees have a legal duty to have an external scrutiny of the charity's accounts once the income goes over £25,000. The options are audit, or if small enough, independent examination. We've recently published new [directions and guidance for independent examiners CC32](#), which are effective from 1 December 2017. Trustees should make sure that your examiner has a copy of the new guidance. Examiners need to follow CC32 to carry out the examination properly.
